Ber lingo 330

Time Needed:

Prep Time: 20 minutes
Baking Time: 35 minutes
9 x 3 inch Baking Bundt Pan

Ingredients:

(Units in American baking cups)

2 cups of Cake or Pastry Flour

³/₄ cup of sugar

2 whole eggs and an additional 2 yolks

1/4 cup of extra virgin olive oil

Finely grated rind of one lemon

1 packet of raising agent in Italy or 1 Tbsp of baking powder For the glaze: ½ cup of powdered/confectioner's sugar and 1 Tbsp of orange juice

Directions

In a clean mixing bowl, whip the eggs, yolks and sugar into a froth.

Slowly drizzle in the olive oil and once thoroughly mixed add the grated lemon rind.

Now add the cake flour and raising agent (baking powder). Mix with a spatula until you have created a uniform batter.

Butter and flour the Bundt pan and then pour the batter into the pan.

Bake in a ventilated oven pre-heated to 180 degrees Celsius (350 degrees F) for approximately 35 minutes.

To make the topping

Mix the orange juice and sugar in a small pot. Cook over low heat for 5 minutes while stirring constantly.

While still warm, brush the syrup onto the surface of the cake and then sprinkle with granules of sugar.
