

"CARTESIAN DEVIL"



SUPPLIES

- I LITER PLASTIC BOTTLE LIKE SHOWN
- AN EMPTY SMALL VIAL LIKE FROM A PERFUME SAMPLE



FILL THE PLASTIC BOTTLE COMPLETELY UP WITH WATER AND THE VIAL ABOUT HALF WAY UP




Put your finger over the opening of the vial, turn it upside down and then insert it into the bottle. The high surface tension

WILL KEEP THE WATER INSIDE OF THE SMALL VIAL

Do A QUICK TEST ...

SEE IF THE VIAL ONCE INSERTED UPSIDE DOWN
AND CLOSED INSIDE OF THE BOTTLE
SINKS TO THE BOTTOM.

IF SO, REMOVE IT AND fill IT WITH LESS WATER.





TIGHTLY CLOSE THE TAP
OF THE PLASTIC BOTTLE



SQUEEZE THE SIDES

OF THE PLASTIC BOTTLE

AND OBSERVE WHAT HAPPENS....

SQUEEZING THE SIDES OF THE BOTTLE,
THE VIAL SINKS. RELEASING YOUR GRIP
ON THE BOTTLE AND WATCH THE VIAL
RISES BACK UP.



THE PRESSURE FROM YOUR GRIP ON THE SIDES
OF THE BOTTLE FORCES WATER TO ENTER INTO
THE VIAL MAKING IT HEAVIER SO THAT IT SINKS.
ONCE YOU RELEASE YOUR GRIP ON THE BOTTLE,
THE COMPRESSED AIR INSIDE OF THE VIAL
PUSHES THE EXCESS WATER BACK OUT.
THEN THE VIAL IS ONCE AGAIN LIGHT
ENOUGH TO FLOAT INSIDE

THE first PERSON TO PERFORM
THIS EXPERIMENT WAS RAFFAELLO MAGIOTTI,
GALILEO'S STUDENT IN 1648. ANOTHER NAME FOR
THIS INSTRUMENT IS LUDIONE. THIS WORD IS DERIVED
FROM THE FRENCH WORD LUDION WHICH MEANS JOKER
BECAUSE OFTEN TIMES A SMALL JOKER WOULD BE PAINTED ON
THE GLASS OF THE TINY VIAL THAT WOULD THEN MOVE UP AND
DOWN CREATING A MORE ENTERTAINING EFFECT
